## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT

#### **Celebrating 40 Years**

In the February / March issue of Zippers I mentioned that 2024 is our 40-year anniversary and that the Committee is working closely with the team at EMF on plans to celebrate this special milestone with a celebratory lunch in November at the location and around the time of the

month that the inaugural meeting was held in 1984. I can reveal at this early stage that the lunch will be held on 15 November at Epworth Richmond. A delicious sit-down lunch will be served, a very special guest speaker has accepted our invitation to make a presentation, and much more celebratory activity is planned. An invitation will be mailed to members later in the year - in the meantime, please **save the date in your diary: "15 November 2024 - Heartbeat 40th Anniversary Lunch".** 

#### Heartbeat 2023-24 Cardiac Equipment Campaign

**Some other wonderful news is that our 2023-24 Cardiac Equipment Campaign is now completed.** This campaign raised \$121,325 to fund the purchase of a Supine Ergometer (\$22,330) and 4 Echocardiogram beds (\$17,000) for Epworth Richmond, and a Rotablator (\$81,995) for Epworth Eastern. This is a truly amazing result that could only have been achieved with the generosity of our members who donated to the 2023-24 Annual Appeal and our volunteers who have raised a significant part of the campaign funds. On behalf of the Committee, thank you to Heartbeat members, supporters and volunteers for your contributions.

#### Heartbeat Epworth 2024-25 Annual Appeal

As one campaign ends, a new campaign commences! In 2024-25 we will be raising funds to establish a research grant for cardiac nurses - Heartbeat Epworth Brookes Academy Cardiac Nurse Research Grant.

This Research Grant is to be funded jointly by Heartbeat Epworth, Epworth Medical Foundation, and a donor who wishes to remain anonymous. A dedicated Cardiac Nurse Research Grant will enable Epworth nurses to undertake research into an area of cardiac treatment and care that focuses on better ways to care for patients today and into the future.

Heartbeat Epworth is proud and excited to support improved outcomes for cardiac patients through the Brookes Academy research program. As we celebrate our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary and look to the future, it is fitting that Heartbeat Epworth members and supporters are going to play an integral and direct role in an initiative to help cardiac nurses to discover, learn and grow throughout their career – an initiative that will benefit generations to come.

Every dollar donated to the Heartbeat Epworth 2024-25 Annual Appeal will be matched by another three dollars and directed to the **Heartbeat Epworth Brookes Academy Cardiac Nurse Research Grant.**








#### RICHMOND

A Heartbeat Centenary Scholarship was awarded in 2022 to Jo Kevill, Cardiac Rehabilitation Coordinator at Epworth Camberwell, to develop the Epworth Cardiac Rehabilitation Ambassador Initiative.




The four participants in the 2002 group described feeling much more confident to discuss cardiac rehabilitation with their patients at the completion of their cardiac rehabilitation experience and were keen to share their learnings with other cardiac ward staff.

Based on the success of the first year of the Ambassador Initiative, and while work is underway to ensure that 'cardiac rehabilitation ambassadorship' becomes a strong and lasting feature of patient care on cardiac wards, Heartbeat Epworth has sponsored a further seven cardiac nurses to be part of the program.

## **RELIEF AND GRATITUDE - POWERFUL EMOTIONS**

It is such a privilege to be part of the Pastoral Care team here at Epworth (Richmond). We have the opportunity to journey with some amazing people going through challenging times! Although it can be emotionally difficult listening to patients' struggles, it is also inspiring to hear and see how people can rise above their challenges.

I recently visited a patient on the cardiac ward whose reflection of their experience was both heart-warming and inspiring.

This older patient was in need of surgery to replace a faulty heart valve but, because of the risks involved, their family was not supportive of surgery. However, after much consideration, they decided to proceed although aware that doing so came with significant risks.

Wonderfully, the surgery was completed successfully. The patient was in the recovery phase when I visited them and I was struck by the joy they exuded, even though they knew there was a lengthy and challenging recovery and rehabilitation process ahead.

Reflecting on their experience, they spoke to me of their strong feelings of relief and gratitude and I was reminded of the blessing of these two quite powerful emotions:

- Relief that positive emotion we experience when something unpleasant, painful, perhaps even threatening, has not happened or has come to an end. The point when feelings of anxiety or stress fall away!
- Gratitude in the context of our patients, we might define it as that strong feeling of deep appreciation for what someone has done for us. This was certainly how this patient felt ... deep appreciation for what the medical teams had done for them in giving them an opportunity to live a healthier life and to experience life more abundantly!

Interestingly, there is considerable research investigating how gratitude may benefit people with various medical or psychological challenges. It appears this particularly applies to cardiac patients!

What a privilege to be part of helping patients experience relief and gratitude and, hopefully, a better quality of life!

It's been said that 'a life well lived is built upon a life well examined'. It is a privilege to be able to offer people the opportunity to reflect on and examine their life and the experience of being a patient here at Epworth. Relief and gratitude – powerful emotions that each of us can foster in others and in ourselves!
